

## Instructions for a self-guided tour of the museum

### before your visit

- Always announce your plans to visit via e-mail ([groepsbezoek@verzetsmuseum.org](mailto:groepsbezoek@verzetsmuseum.org)) or telephone (+31 20 620 25 36) to make sure that your group (maximum 30 students) can be accommodated.
- Please print the workbooks in colour yourself and bring them with you. The workbooks are also available for purchase at the museum, at € 1,50 percopy. If you wish to buy the books at the museum, please let us know well beforehand. They are not always available in bulk.

- Allow about 1 hour to complete the workbook and about 1½ hours total in the museum.

### in the museum

- When you arrive, ask the people at the desk to direct you to the information island. Once there, you can watch an introductory film of 10 minutes. It's in Dutch with English subtitles. The same film can be seen on our website:

- Explain the workbook assignment to the students.  
Be sure to include the following:

- **Banners:** each period of the War begins with a green banner on the wall. Included on the banner is a map with the situation in Europe and the Netherlands and together, all of the banners form a connecting thread throughout the museum. Each represents an important turning point in the period of occupation. Have you reached a new banner? Then you should have found answers to all the questions in the preceding period.
- **Photos:** look at the picture in the workbook. Find the same picture in the museum and you'll find the answer to a question. Note: sometimes it can actually be a wall-sized photograph and sometimes quite small.
- **Green text boards:** this is where you will find a lot of information about the subject covered in the question. Each text board has a number that is sometimes referred to in the workbook.
- **Dilemmas:** in various places throughout the museum, dilemmas are put into words projected on the floor. In the immediate area of this projection, you will find the issues that people considered at the time: what choices did they make and why?

- Please make sure the students are spread throughout the museum. You can let them begin in small groups at various periods.
